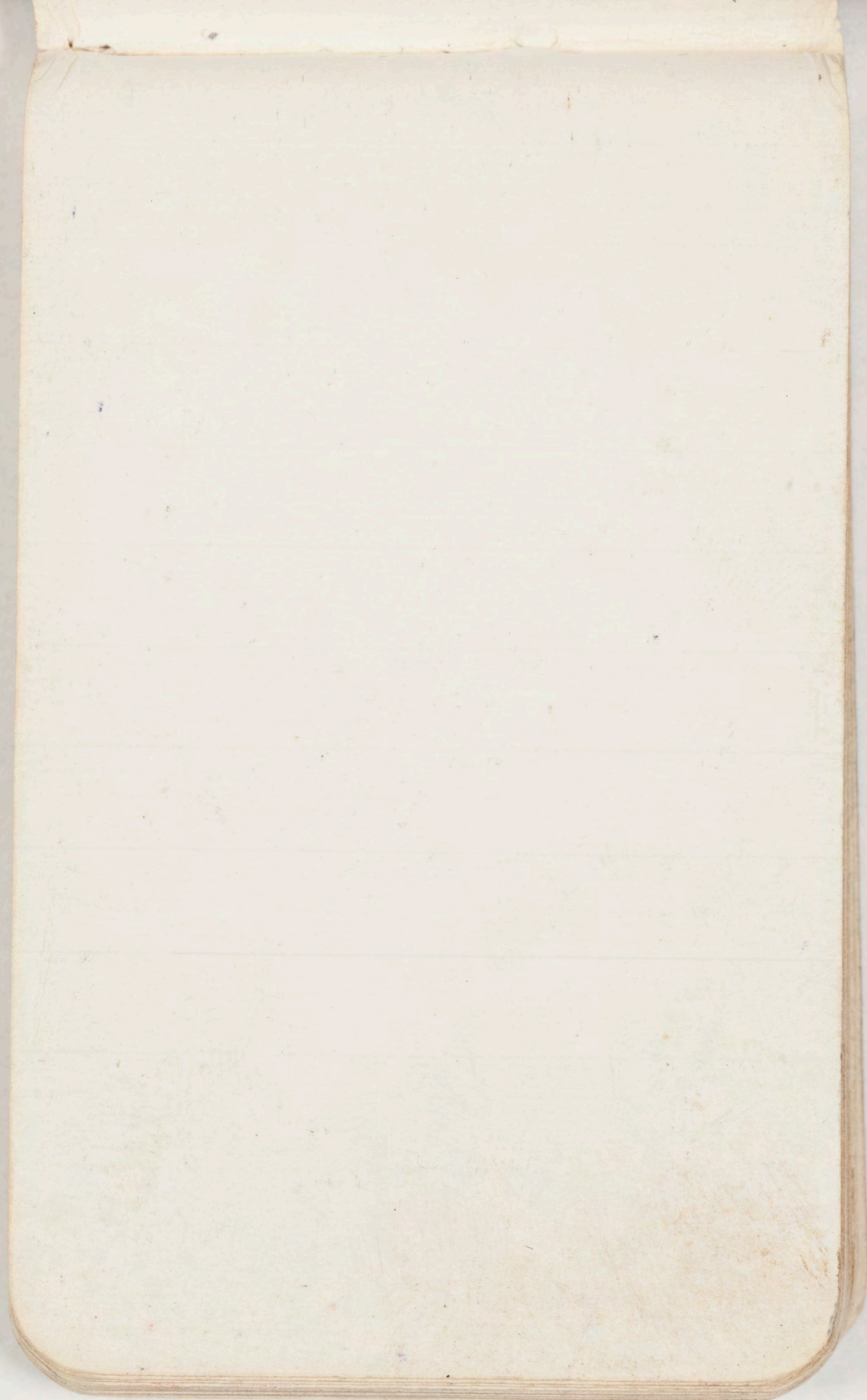

place is about 2  
miles away.

3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> PM when we



got orders to  
return to our lines  
at once, and when  
we get there, there  
is not a tent stand-  
ing, and all men  
are packed ready  
to move off. We  
are issued with iron  
rations and have  
tea and go to the



railway at 9 PM.  
board it at 11 PM and  
start for Alexandria.  
33 of us are put in a  
small truck about  
14 feet long. so there is  
no room to move.

June 6<sup>th</sup>

We travel on in the  
early hours of the



morning via Zagga-  
Zig and <sup>by</sup> Teh-el Baroud.  
at one place we cross  
a Bridge over the  
Nile about 300 yds.  
long. All the way  
there are small  
canals and a large  
irrigation aerie. We  
arrive at Alexandria  
at 7.30 A.M. and go



at once on to the  
ship, "<sup>a</sup>Tranconia"  
(N6) I don't like it  
as well as the "Ceramic"  
we have bunks to  
sleep in and they  
will be very hot.

June 7<sup>th</sup>. We leave  
Alexandria at 11 AM.  
all men must



have life belts no  
matter where they  
are. We are allotted  
our boats in case  
of accident and  
told what to do.  
at times we see our  
escorts in the distance

June 8<sup>th</sup>

Our Company is on  
duty and I am detailed



for Guard, but  
after doing two  
shifts I have to  
be taken to the  
Dr- who sends  
me to the Hospital  
at once the cause  
being Influenza.

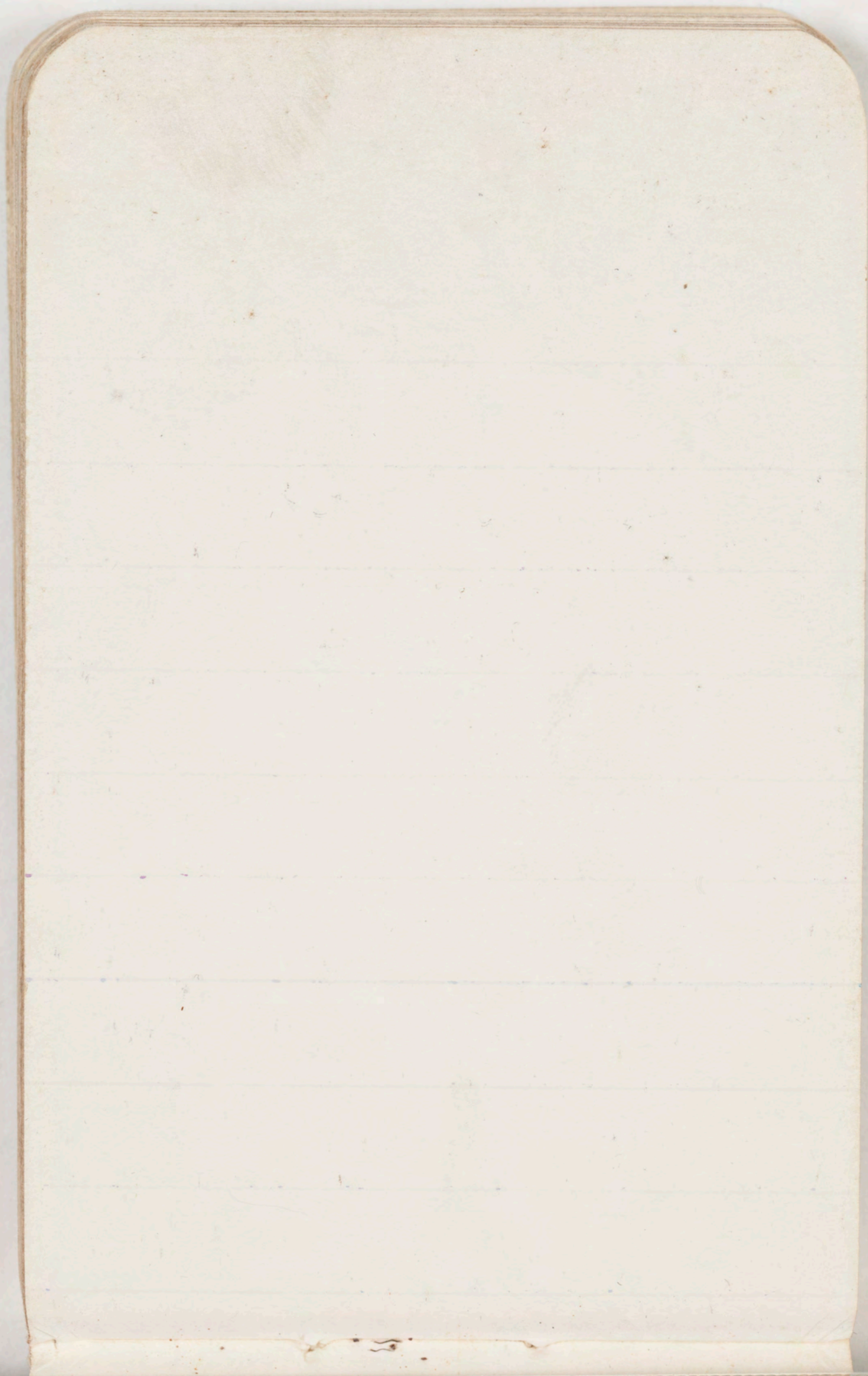

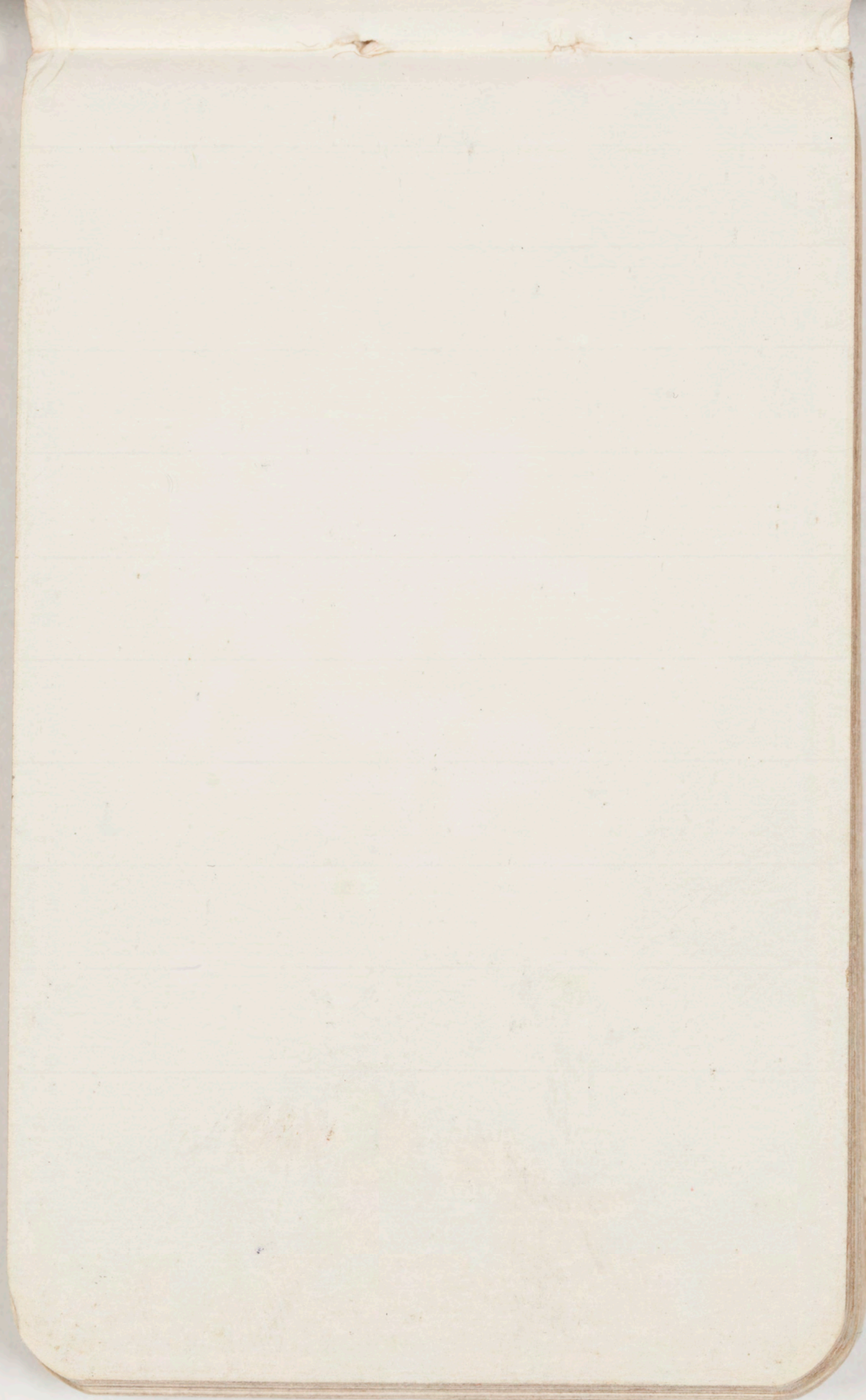
