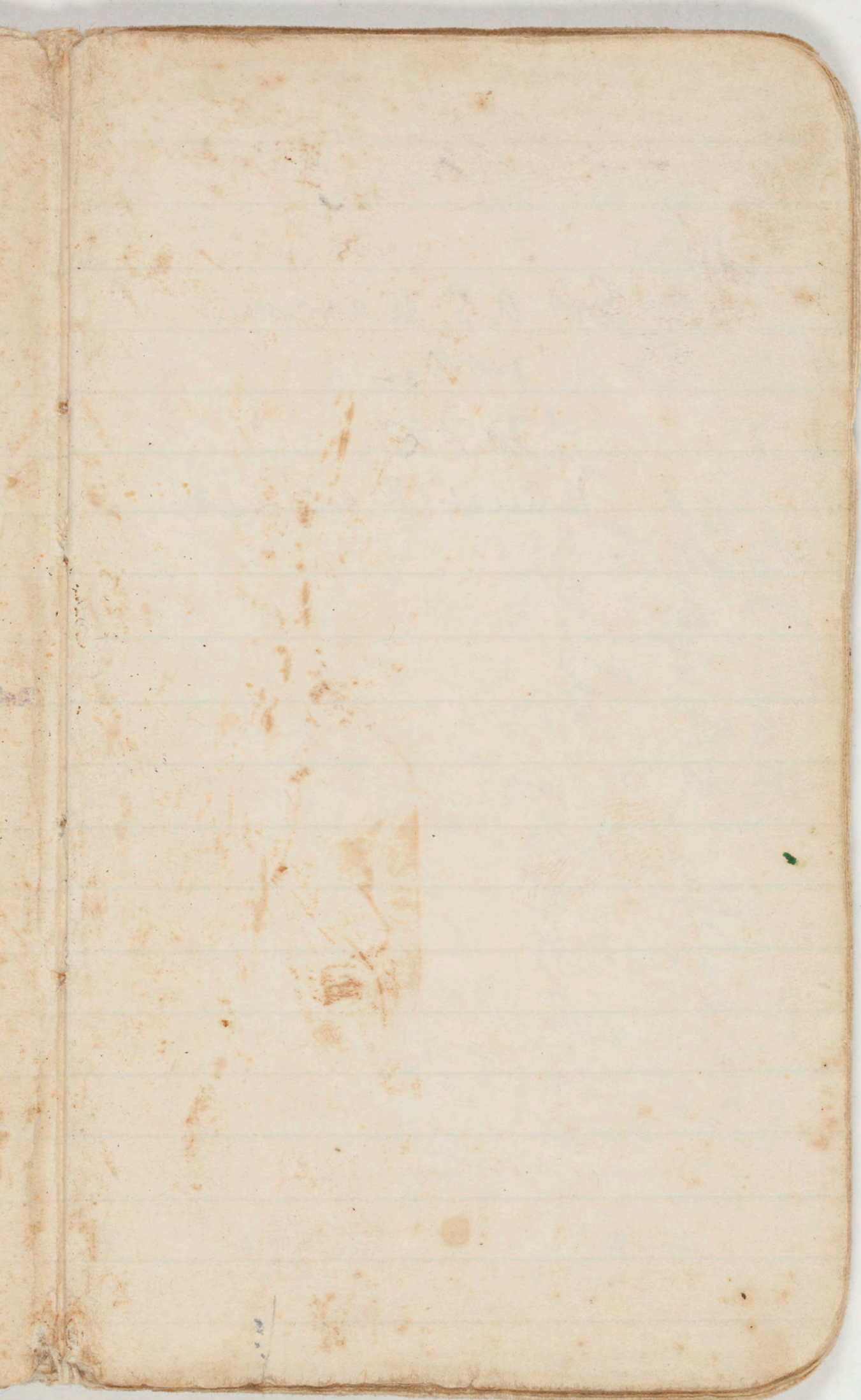

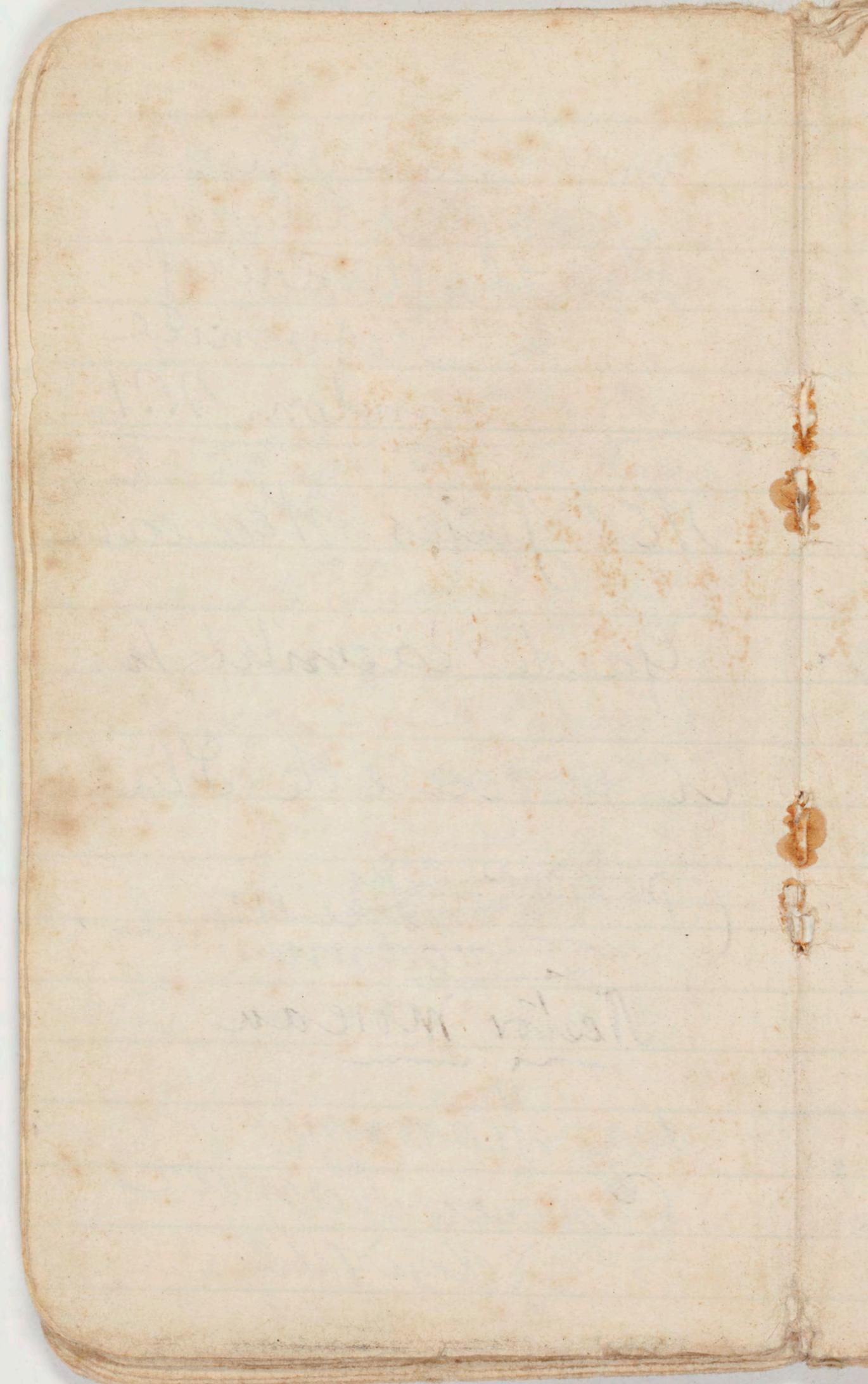

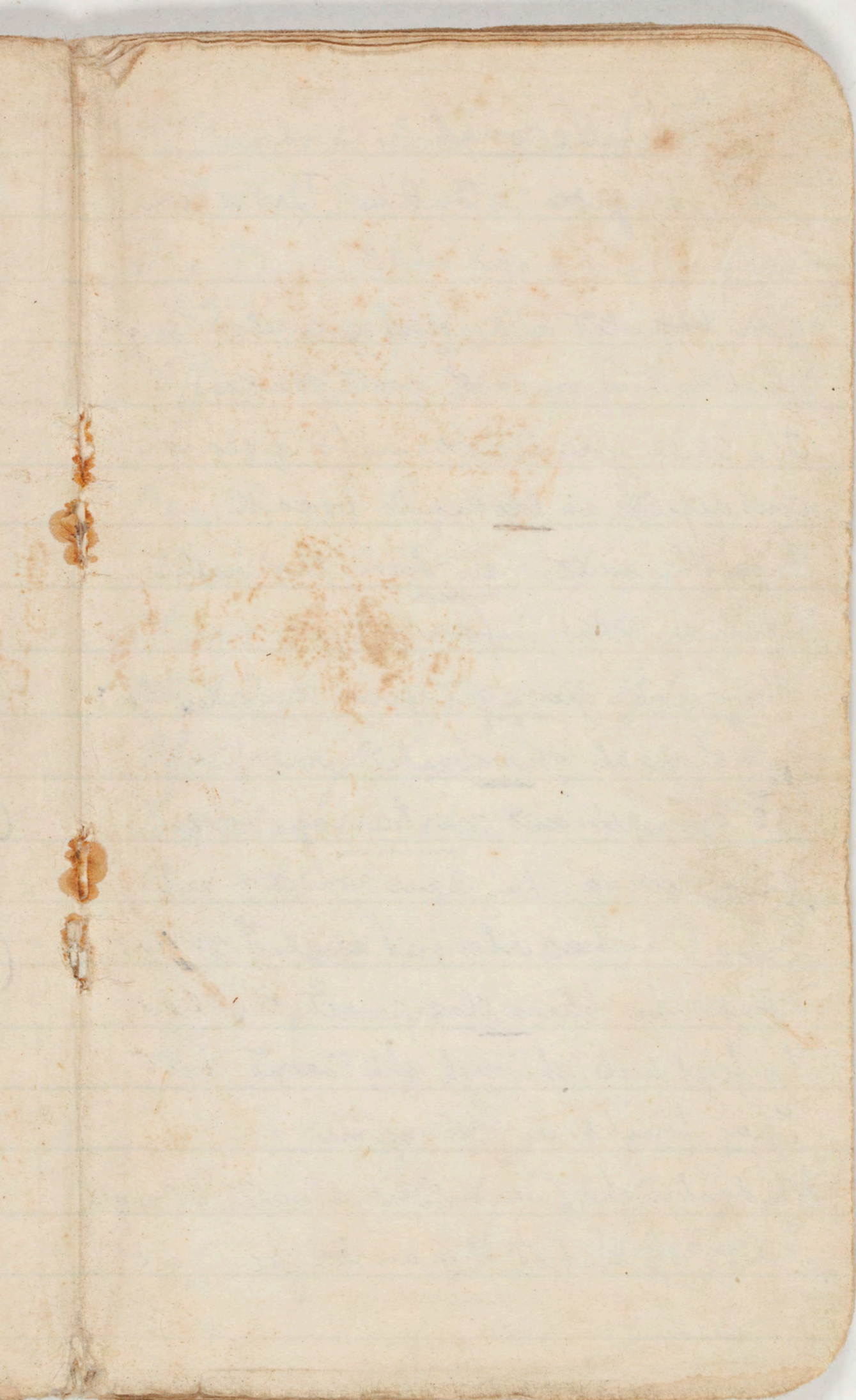

They broke — 9 a few got out.

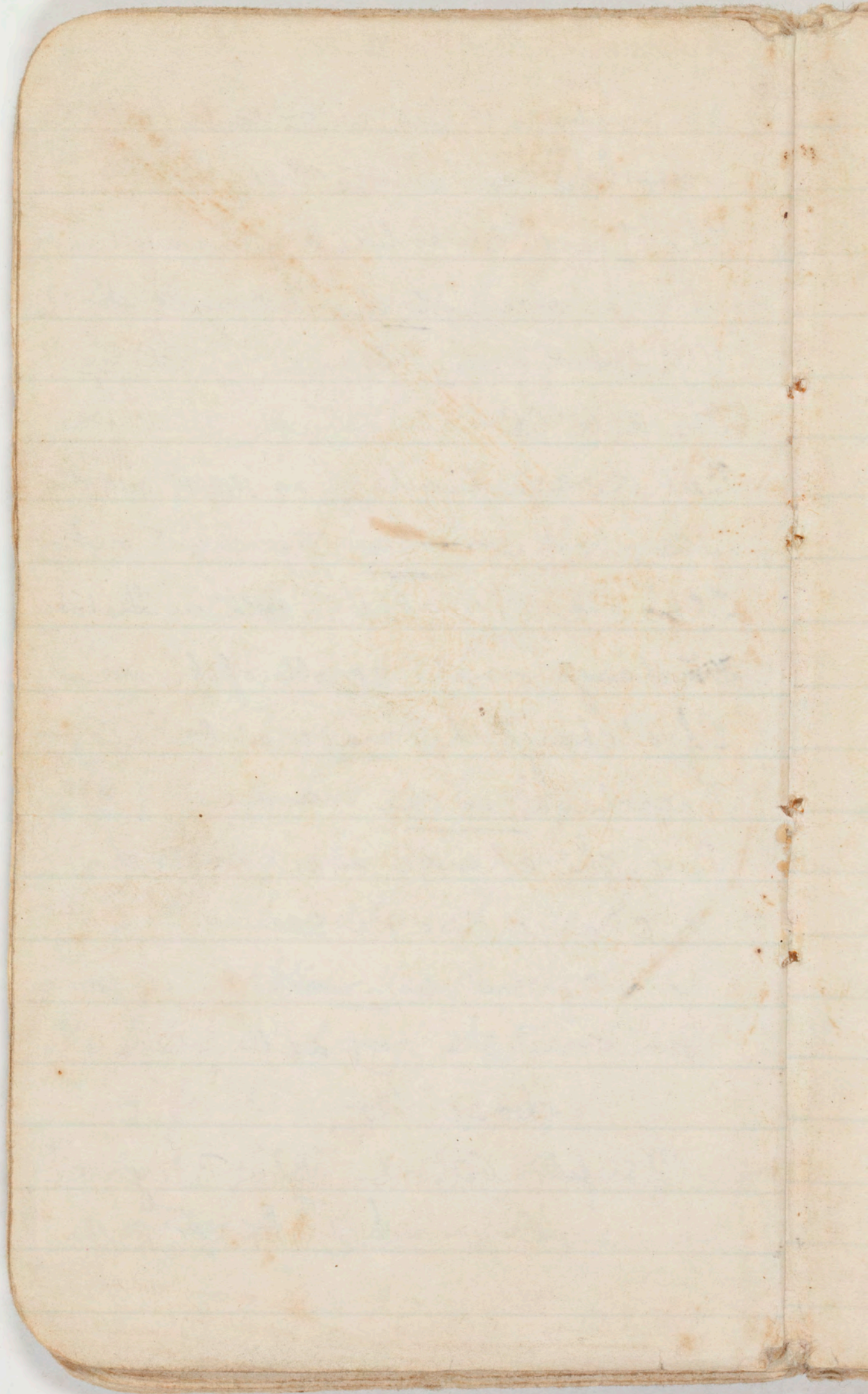
