E426: The band of the 5th Australian Infantry Brigade, led by Bandmaster Sergeant Pheagan, of the 19th Battalion, passing through the Grande Place, Bapaume, France, 19th March 1917, playing the *Victoria March*

E4789: The Hotel de Ville, Amiens, France, 30th April 1918

E4722: Old French wire in the reserve area of the Somme, near Baizieux, France, 22nd April 1918

E5248: Beaucourt Chateau, near Pozieres, France, in the Chapel of which was established an Australian Advanced Dressing Station during the fighting at Pozieres and Mouquet Farm, July 1918

E4860: A general view of a steep hillside at Blangy-Trouville, France, 30th May 1918

E4782: A British 6-inch Howitzer under camouflage near the village of Bresle, France, 21st April 1918

E4783: Two men of the Australian Field Artillery at a gun position near Bresle, France, 21st April 1918

E1877: A flight of Australian Scouting Machines at Bruay, France, 24th March 1918, ready to start bombing trip over the enemy lines

E2498: The ruins of the church at Buire, France, 14th June 1918

E2180: The timber bridge constructed by the 7th Field Company of Australian Engineers over the Somme river, near Camon, France, May 1918

E4838: A camouflage bridge across the Somme near Corbie, 24th May 1918

E4801: Camouflaged nine-inch guns at Corbie, France, May 1918, when they were employed in supporting the Australian Corps

E2697: English, American and Australian troops lunching in the shade near Corbie, France, 3rd July 1918, the day prior to the attack and capture of the German positions at Hamel and Vaire Wood

E4905: The shrapnel-pitted stone archway leading into the square at Corbie, France, 18th June 1918, when the front line was about three kilometres away

E2295: Members of the 28th Battalion, A.I.F. in the front line at Dernancourt, France, 27th April 1918

E4895: Gas projectors set for use alongside the Albert-Amiens railway near the Dernancourt Casualty Clearing Station, France, 14th June 1918

E4897: A set of 80 gas projectors alongside the Albert-Amiens railway in front of the C.C.S. at Dernancourt, France, 14th June 1918

E2363: The type of bridge used by the Australian infantry to cross the Somme Canal during April and May, at the point of the Canal near Hamelet, France, 24th May 1918

E3926: A reaping machine in a wheat field between Hamelet and Fouilloy, France, August 1918

E2632: The Australian barrage on enemy territory to assist the attack on Hamel, 4th July 1918, by the 6th, 4th and 11th Infantry Brigades, assisted by a battalion of Americans

E3840: Attack by Australian and American troops at Hamel, France, 4th July 1918

E2108: A view from the steps at the entrance to the Chateau at Heilly, France, 23 April 1918. The 3rd Australian Division was operating in the area at the time

E4708: Watering horses of the 7th Australian Field Artillery Brigade at Heilly, France, 5th April 1918

E4671: The Chateau at Heilly, France, 5th April 1918, used as Brigade Headquarters by the 3rd Australian Division, whilst the troops were engaged astride the Ancre and the Somme in holding up the enemy penetration toward Amiens E3884: The 5th Australian Infantry Brigade with tanks advance towards the third objective near La Motte en Santerre, France 8th August 1918

E4814: A Howitzer battery of the Australian Field Artillery behind a bank on a hillside near Lavieville, France, 24th April 1918

E4910: French, American and Australian troops, 21st June 1918, at the International Post, established at the junction of the French and Australian lines in the trenches near Monument Wood, on the right of Villers Bretonneux

E4892: A group of American and Australian soldiers outside the Chateau at Querrieu, France, 10th May 1918

E4779: Guns of the Australian Field Artillery concealed in Hayricks at Ribemont, France, 21st April 1918

E2319: Germans shelling Welcome Wood, east of Vaux-sur-Somme, France, 12th April 1918

E5402: Corner of the Bois l'Abbee and the approach to Villers-Bretonneux, France, 16th June 1918 (the 13th and 15th Australian Infantry Brigades, attacking on either side of the town and recapturing it on 24th April 1918)

E2343: A view 21st May 1918, from the roof of the White Chateau, at Villiers-Bretonneux, when the Australian held white chalk line of trenches as their front line, and the enemy trenches were in front of Monument Wood

E4851: Gassed Australian soldiers lying out in the open at an over-crowded aid post near Bois de l'Abbe, France, 27th May 1918. They had been gassed in the operations in front of Villers-Bretonneux

E2157: The Church of Villers-Bretonneux, in France, in May 1918

E4907: A quarry on the Amiens Road near Villers-Bretonneux, in France, photographed on June 20<sup>th</sup>, 1918, when occupied as the Headquarters of the 37<sup>th</sup> Battalion, A.I.F.

E4909: Members of the 3rd Australian Division salvaging wool and paper from one of the factories near Villers-Bretonneux, France, 21st June 1918

E4921: Australian Engineers laying down a telephone cable to the forward lines near Villers-Bretonneux, France, 11th July 1918

E2811: The ruined church of Villers-Brettonneux, France, 11th July 1918

E3908: Depicts an incident which marked the assembly of the tanks prior to the offensive of 8th August 1918, Villers-Bretonneux, France, 17th August 1918

E3075: German prisoners captured in the Australian advance on the Somme, leaving the compound near Villers-

Bretonneux, France, 27th August 1918, for the concentration camps in the back areas

E5476: A general view of Crucifix Corner cemetery, Villers-Bretonneux, France, 21st July 1919

E5487: The replica of a tablet to be placed on a monument erected in the cemetery of Villers-Bretonneux, France, by French citizens to the memory of the Australian who fell in defence of the town in Spring 1918, 17th July 1919

E2481: One of the two Cantilever bridges erected by Lieutenant Davies, M.C. of the 6th Field Company of Australian Engineers, to enable a party of the 24th Battalion to cross in the attack on Ville-sur-Ancre, 19th May 1918

E2480: A log and duck-board bridge constructed by the 6th Field Company of Australian Engineers across the River Ancre, for use by the 24th Battalion in their attack on Ville-sur-Ancre, France, 19th May 1918

E2710: The house near Ville-sur-Ancre, upon which a successful local attack was carried out by companies of the 58th and 59th Battalions, during the Battle of Hamel, France, 4th July 1918

E4809: Camouflaged positions of the 12th Australian Mobile Artillery Brigade at Busnes, France, 16th May

E2088: The shelling of the 9th Battalion billets in the reserve line at Borre, Northern France, 17th April 1918

E4743: Members of the 1st Australian Infantry Brigade, 16th April 1918, when bivouacking for the night near Borre, Northern France

E2334: Street in Caestre, France, May 1918, showing the partially wrecked church tower

E4746: Members of the 21st Australian Machine Gun Company manning hastily dug trenches in a field near Strazeele, Northern France, 16th April 1918

E3274: Kamarad, shows a party of German soldiers in the act of surrendering to troops of the 45th Australian Battalion, who were advancing beyond Ascension Farm, near Le Verguier, France, 18th September 1918

E3259: The 45th Australian Battalion at the final objective of 18th September 1918, overlooking Ascension Valley, near Le Verguier, France

E3767: An enemy armour-plated, two-seated fighting biplane brought down early in October near Sonia Wood, Beaurevoir sector, France, 10th October 1918
