BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

James Romney served as a Lieutenant Colonel in the East India Service and was very close to his brother, artist George Romney. They were both born in the same year (1734), George on 26 December and James probably in January. James Romney served in the Bombay Army from 1779-1804.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection comprises ca. 600 sheets, mostly annotated folio manuscript drafts of plays, poetry, articles and letters written by James Romney whilst serving as a Lieutenant Colonel in the East India Service. Items in this substantial collection date between 1775 to 1802, and regularly refer to the European experience in India. Many of the pieces were written for publication and were addressed to the Editors of local journals.
